- Provide common understanding among users.
- Common sense is not automatic, its learned
- Avoid misuse and apply remedies
- Encourages buy-in to ensure participation
- Increase resource efficiencies

What is the National Incident Management System?

NIMS provides a consistent nationwide template.

- Enable Federal, State, tribal, and local governments, the private sector, and nongovernmental organizations to work together.
- Prepare for, prevent, respond to, recover from, and mitigate the effects of incidents regardless of cause, size, location, or complexity.
- Reduce the loss of life and property, and harm to the environment.

 - Who to notify
- Common Usage Channels

SOPs for Field Units

Field Units

- Assigning frequencies on-scene
- Strengthen NIMS through communications
- Radio Procedures

Training

- No one knows what to do without training
- "Common sense" is not automatic, its learned behavior
- Radios are a tool, like firearms and hose.
- Get dispatchers and field units trained
 - On-line resources
 - Classroom training

Husker Analogy

- Coach Pelini practices the game plan all week long.
- Practices get progressively more realistic and difficult.

Exercising

- SOPs without exercises are a "myth"
- Gear your exercises to test the radios
 - Test dispatchers and units
 - Actually use the equipment, no simulations
- Involve your neighbors, State
- Don't fear failure. We exercise to expose weaknesses.
