Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)

The HSGP comprises of 3 program areas:

- State Homeland Security (SHSP)
- Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS)
- Citizen Corps (CCP)

SHSP supports the implementation of State Homeland Security Strategies to address the identified planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events.

MMRS program supports the integration of emergency management, health, and medical systems into a coordinated response to mass casualty incidents caused by any hazard.

CCP's mission is to bring community and government leaders together to coordinate the involvement of community members and organizations in emergency preparedness, planning, mitigation, response, and recovery.

Overview of grant dollars awarded to Nebraska

80/20 split requirement: 80% of the

dollars must be awarded at the local level, and 20% may be retained at the state level. Sometimes the Regions will MOU money back to the state to support statewide projects to spend on their behalf.

Investments supported: Interoperable Communications, Planning, Exercise and Training (PET), Law Enforcement, Hazmat, Agriculture, MMRS and CCP.
